

## Rules, Reservations & Fees 2012

Reservations accepted in person, on our website, fax or phone., Monday - Friday.

### Camping Fees

The campsite fee is a flat rate per campsite per night. All reservations must be paid in full.

### Camping Rules & Regulations

- 1) Keep it quiet, especially after 9:30 pm. Headphones must be used with audio equipment.
- 2) Please observe the 6 person limit at small campsites and the 12 person limit at group campsites. There will be a \$35 fine for each person over the age of 2 above these limits. Groups may not rent more than one site per island/area per night.
- 3) Never leave a campfire unattended. Campfires may be prohibited during periods of high fire danger.
- 4) Do NOT gather firewood at the site; firewood is available for \$3 a bundle at SLA and \$6 a bundle at the docks. Please get your one free bundle per night at the dock.
- 5) Tents must be setup on platforms where provided to prevent ground compaction.
- 6) Check-in is at 12:30 and check-out is at 11:30. Fines apply for late check-out
- 7) Motor boats are not permitted within float lines at anytime.
- 8) This is a Pack It In, Pack It Out facility. No trash receptacles are available.
- 9) Pets on a leash are allowed on Bowman Island and at Chamberlain-Reynolds Memorial Forest. NO pets on Moon Island.
- 10) Fire wood cannot be brought from home it must be purchased locally to prevent the spread of invasive species.

Violations subject to \$35 fine per day/occurrence or be asked to leave if found breaking any of the regulations above.

## Leave No Trace on Squam

### Plan Ahead and Prepare

- Know the area and what to expect
- Select appropriate equipment
- Repackage food to reduce litter



### Travel and Camp on Durable Surfaces

- Camp only in designated campsites
- Always stay on the trails
- Concentrate impact on durable surfaces

### Properly Dispose of Waste

- PACK IT IN, PACK IT OUT
- Toilets are provided at each camping area
- Disperse dishwater at least 200 feet from the lake

### Minimize Campfire Impacts

- Bring a campstove for cooking
- Purchase wood locally or buy it from SLA
- Never leave a campfire unattended

### Leave What You Find

- Do not alter the campsites
- Do not damage plants and trees

### Respect Wildlife

- Enjoy wildlife at a distance
- Avoid sensitive habitat areas

### Be Considerate of Other Visitors

- Let nature's sound prevail
- Respect other's privacy

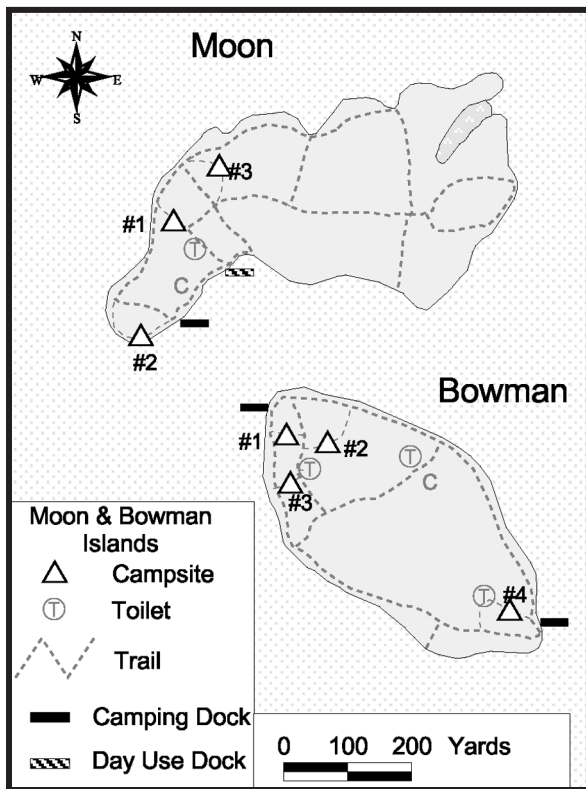

## Moon & Bowman Islands Chamberlain-Reynolds Memorial Forest





### Bowman Island

Bowman Island is a secluded 23-acre island with one small beach near the dock for campsites #1, 2, 3 and a dock at Bowman #4. Pets are allowed on Bowman Island but must be on leash and attended at all times.

**Bowman #1 small site (6 person Max.)**

**Bowman #2 small site (6 person Max.)**

Three raised 10 x 10 wooden platforms

**Bowman #3 small site (6 person Max.)**

Three 10 x 10 pea stone platforms

**Bowman #4 group site (12 person Max.)**

Three raised 10 x 12 wooden platforms



### Moon Island

This 30-acre island was purchased by the SLA in 1986. There are small beaches which may be used for landing non-motorized boats and a camping dock is located near Moon # 2. The day use dock is located near the toilet and is reserved for loading and unloading only. Pets are not permitted on Moon Island.

**Moon #1 group site (12 person Max.)**

Three raised 10 x 12 wooden platforms

**Moon #2 small site (6 person Max.)**

Three 10 x 10 pea stone platforms

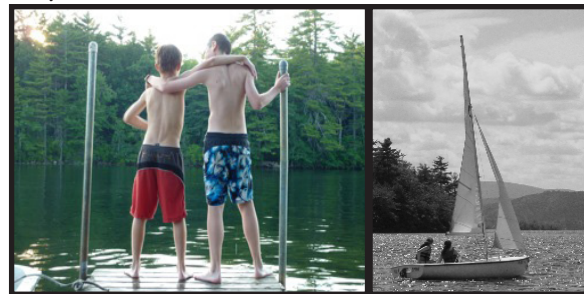
**Moon #3 small site (6 person Max.)**

### Cancellation Policy

Full refund, less a \$10 handling fee, if cancellation is 14 days or more prior to camping date. 50% refund if cancellation is 7 days or more prior to camping. No refund with less than 7 days notice.



### Boat Access Areas

- **SLA Resource Center**— Canoes, kayaks, sailboats and motorboats of 25 hp or less: on Route 3 in Holderness.
- **SLA Boat Rentals** —Boats should be reserved in advance and picked up by 4:30 pm.
- **Public Boat Ramp**— All watercraft: along Route 113 in Holderness, on the Squam River, opposite the Squam Lakes Natural Science Center. Parking is for vehicles with trailers only and has a 24 hour parking limit.
- **Belknap Woods** — Carry in access only: along Route 25-B in Center Harbor. Park along the highway; 300' walk to lake.

### Chamberlain-Reynolds Memorial Forest

This 159-acre forest with over a mile of waterfront, a swamp walk, and three splendid beaches is owned by the New England Forestry Foundation and is managed for public use by the Squam Lakes Association. Pets are allowed but must be on leash at all times. All sites except for Heron Cove can be accessed from the College Road parking lots via a one mile hike, or by one of two docks on Wister point. Heron Cove, the most secluded site, can only be accessed by the dock on the east side of Heron Cove.
